

## Jovid Foundation Grants Awarded in 2000

In 2000, the Foundation's grants fell into five areas: Employment and Training Programs and Evaluation; Economic and Poverty Research; Arts/Education; Foundation/Nonprofit Institutional Support; and, Other. In 2000, the Foundation paid grants totaling \$775,940.
