

Jovid Foundation Grants Awarded in 2001

In 2001, the Foundation's grants fell into five areas: Employment and Training Programs and Evaluation; Economic and Poverty Research; Performing Arts; Foundation/Nonprofit Institutional Support; and, Other. In 2001, the Foundation paid 52 grants totaling \$491,200.
