

2004 Annual Report

In 2004, the Jovid Foundation awarded grants in four areas: Employment and Training Programs; Performing Arts; Foundation/Nonprofit Institutional Support; and Mini-Grants. In 2004, the Foundation awarded grants to 59 organizations which totaled \$458,066. In addition, the Foundation paid \$75,500 on grants awarded in previous years. Total paid during 2004 was \$526,066.
