Program description

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Scholarship Funds: The foundation administers over 170 separate scholarship funds, many of which are for students interested in specific subjects, such as music, art, nursing, education, business, and engineering. Almost all awards are for undergraduate college study, although a few awards are made to graduate students, primarily for medical education. Some awards are given to graduates of specific schools.
